Additional Public School Capital Construction Funding	CO HB1070		Currently, the first \$40 million of retail marijuana excise tax revenue annually collected is credited to the public school capital construction assistance fund (assistance fund) for purposes of the "Building Excellent Schools TodayAct" (BEST) and the remainder of the revenue is credited to the state public school fund. For state fiscal years commencing on and after July 1, 2018, sections 1 and 3 of the bill increase the amount of retail marijuana excise tax revenue credited to the assistance fund to the greater of 90% of the revenue annually collected or the first \$40 million of such revenue. The remainder of the revenue continues to be credited to the state public school fund. Section 2 increases the maximum total annual amount of lease payments on BEST lease-purchase agreements authorized to be paid with both state money and local matching money to \$110 million for the 2018-19 fiscal year and \$120 million for the 2019-20 fiscal year and for each fiscal year thereafter. Coloradans for Coloradans Transportation Ballot Measure			"Coloradans for Coloradans" along with the Metro Denver Chamber of Commerce and a handful of other statewide industry organizations who are leading a broad statewide coalition working to get an initiative on the 2018 ballot that will increase the state sales tax to invest in our state, county and city transportation systems. We are planning to file a number of initiatives with the Secretary of State this week. The base measure will increase the sales tax by .5% (a half a penny for each \$1 spent on consumer goods). This will raise about \$550 million per year to be shared between CDOT (45%), Counties (20%), Cities (20%) and multi-modal services (15%). CDOT would be authorized to bond up to about \$4 billion for high priority projects across the state using their share of the new revenue to service the bond debt payments. We are also working to secure an annual commitment of \$150-\$300 million to transportation from the state General Fund. This may be done legislatively or as part of the initiated measure. Last month the CCA Board voted to invest \$50,000 of CCA's reserves to the campaign and the CIC 527 followed with a \$50,000 match for a \$100,000 initial investment in the campaign. The Denver Chamber has also contributed \$100,000. This is just the start of the funds that will be needed to run a winning campaign this year.		monitoring	2/28/2018
